Many existing failing & underperforming on-lot septic systems in the Village


Poorly drained soils, shallow bedrock & small lots render replacement systems impossible

New housing & business impossible without basic sanitation

New housing needed to save the school & Town

Rural Edge Housing & Community
Development– conversion of Town
Hall building into affordable
apartments

Town-owned WW needed to preserve public health & the environment



# 6 Disposal Area Parcels Not Viable






St. Michaels Church

## What is a Community Wastewater Disposal System?






### Revised Project Layout

## Town of Wolcott Elementary School Ball Fields











Recently, 81% of voters in the Wolcott Town School District overwhelmingly approved a permanent easement sale for Community Wastewater Disposal on the Wolcott Town Elementary School Ball Field. Shortly after, Wolcott voters passed a bond vote to fund the proposed community wastewater project.



# What Has Changed?

**PREVIOUSLY** 

#### Sale of 5.64 acres

- Church sells ownership of 5.64 acres
- Retain limited passive recreational use

NOW

#### Permanent Easement of 2 acres

- Church maintains ownership of 5.64-acre property
- Church receives \$12,060
- Retains future cemetery use and other future property uses

Rural edge affordable housing project (requires a wastewater system)

**Economic development** in the Village

Extend life/possible expansion of Nursing Home
