

Greensboro Town Survey Report Summary

In 2024, Greensboro conducted a town-wide survey to understand residents' concerns, preferences, and priorities. With **242 responses (~29% of the population)**, 167 voters, and 75 non-voters, the survey sheds light on key issues facing the town.






- Demographics:
 - Majority are couples or single-person households.
 - Senior residents dominate, with **80% having at least one senior** in their home.
 - Few households (9%) include school-age children.


Top Issues

- 1. Cost of Living:
 - Property taxes are the biggest expense (62% of respondents), followed by mortgage/rent costs.



2. Housing:

• Strong demand for **Single and Two-Family Dwellings, Affordable housing**, and **Clustered Housing.**




3.Healthcare Access:

 Residents cite long travel times, limited local services, and pharmacy closures as significant barriers.

4.Environmental Conservation:


• Protecting Caspian Lake and local wildlife habitats remains a top priority.



Energy Use and Sustainability

- Propane, wood, and oil are the primary heating fuels. However, notably, 10% use solar energy as their primary fuel source and 20% responded that they used solar energy on some level.
- **56** respondents invested in solar arrays, and **93** improved insulation in their homes within the last five years.
- Interest in renewable energy installations like community solar (62%) and EV charging stations (43%) is high.

Transportation



- Most households own gas-powered vehicles, but 25% have hybrid or electric vehicles.
- Annual mileage averages ~12,687 miles, reflecting the rural lifestyle.

Community Life and Activities

- Residents value Greensboro's natural beauty, outdoor activities, and small-town feel.
- Suggested events include:
 - Winter festivals, summer art/music events, and food-focused gatherings.
 - Potluck dinners and community dialogues to foster connection.

Economic and Infrastructure Needs

- Priorities include better broadband access, small business support, and improved roads.
- Interest in economic development includes more restaurants, agricultural ventures, and retail options.

Key Opportunities for Improvement

- 1. Communication:
 - Enhanced use of website, email, a town calendar, and social media is widely requested.

2. Transportation:

- 17% of respondents support shared transportation services, though actual use may vary.
- 3. Zoning and Development:
 - Calls for relaxing the 10-acre zoning rule to allow for more housing options.

• Proximity to nature, a sense of peace, and a tight-knit community rank highest in what residents cherish about Greensboro.
