Doing a construction project?

Did you know that Vermont has <u>minimum energy efficiency standards</u> for new and renovated buildings?

The Residential Building Energy Standards (RBES) apply to new single family and multifamily homes up to three stories high, as well as to all major renovations and additions. By <u>law</u>, homeowners, together with their contractor and/or architect, must ensure RBES compliance. Seasonal camps, unheated buildings and some tiny homes are exempt.

Why it matters?

- 1. Lower Bills requires efficient heating, cooling and appliances
- 2. Warm & Dry minimum standards for insulation and moisture control
- 3. Healthy Air requires building ventilation avoiding mold
- 4. Protect Value fewer expensive repairs and adds value when selling
